REMARKS.

Selton Hill fight.
 Sean Connolly with 11 Riflemen lay out at Selton Hill on the night of 10th March awaiting Crown Forces.
 On the evening of 11th March '21, information as to the position of the I.R.A. forces was brought to the officer in charge of Crown Forces at Mohill.
 About 30 of the Crown Forces arrived in lorries armed with rifles and Lewis gun. The I.R.A. were surprised. The scouts who were watching gave warning. A shot fired by a friendly R.I.C. man was heard by Connolly who expected the enemy were passing through and the shot seemed a proof of the enemy's ignorance of their presence in the locality. When the first lorry arrived at Selton Hill, opposite houses occupied by I.R.A. (150 yards distance), fire was opened on the houses with machine gun and rifles. Sean Connolly and the most of the Column were in Flynn's House. They rushed out and Connolly was shot dead. After some firing and manoeuvring Brigade Adj. O'Beirne and 4 others were killed. Bernard Sweeney and John Hunt were wounded and later captured. Sweeney was later rescued and helped by some others to escape.

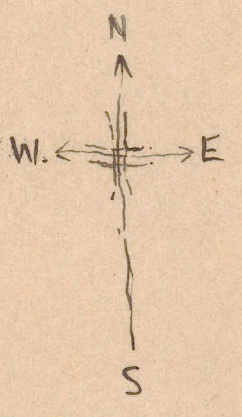
