


Sylvanpark Ambush.

April 1<sup>st</sup>, 1921Kells

Military Police Station → 4 miles



Above is a rough sketch of Sylvanpark where enemy were ambushed on April 1<sup>st</sup> 1921. There was great enemy activity in the area at the time and several prepared ambushes proved abortive. At a meeting of the Batt. officers at Clonagowna, Carnaross, about March 28<sup>th</sup> it was decided to mobilize the four companies Carnaross, Stonefield, Whitegate, and Ballinlough, which went to ambush a convoy the road on certain days at 9 to 10 a.m. and it was decided to send the two Batt. mines to the position the evening before April 1<sup>st</sup>. David Smith, Batt. Comdt. was asked to take charge but suggested Phil Levlin, Dulane, Kells a senior officer of Carnaross Coy. The point of taking charge was not definitely decided as it was considered it made no difference. It was then 5<sup>th</sup> Batt. Meath Brigade and prior to formation of 1<sup>st</sup> Eastern Div. and afterwards 2<sup>nd</sup> Batt. 3<sup>rd</sup> Brigade. A couple of evenings prior to ambush Seamus Finn, Brigade Adj'tant arrived in the Batt area and was shown the positions by Capt. Chas. Conaty, afterwards Batt. Comdt. He arranged

to be present. The men arrived at a disused house as arranged, a quarter of a mile from the scene of the ambush to rest for the night on March 31<sup>st</sup> and move to the positions (which had been inspected) at 6 a.m.

Matt. Levlin, Rathbrack, Carnaross, Batt. Engineer took a party of engineers at midnight and tackled the job of sinking mines in the road and breaking courses for leads through walls and ditches, those were to be ready when party took positions at 6 a.m.

Scouts were placed in the wood at Ballalley and towards Kells, 3 riflemen were placed at the entrance gate to the big residence 3 more riflemen in a covering off position the other side of the road and the main body with shot guns behind the loop-hole wall in the wood and rest the big house. The lady occupants and owners of Sylvanpark house were of planter stock regarded as enemy's and a guard was placed on the place. Strangers, loafers or suspect's were placed in the yards. While the engineers

were placing mines at 5 a.m. a post car horse drawn vehicle (Kells to Crossakiel) with nails were taken and conveyed to prisoners quarters. This brought about the ambush as the Police Authorities when notified sent a convoy in search of the missing Postman. The ambush party waited from 6 a.m. to 3 p.m. for the Military Convoy and were about to vacate the positions when the Crossley tender of Police came from Kells direction. It was signalled by the scouts, the men were at the time covering the raising of the mines, they opened fire on the tender and one Police man or Van was wounded with a bullet through the body.

Riflemen were placed at the entrance gate and in a covering off position on the northern side of the road, while the men with shot-guns were in the loopholed wall towards Sylvanpark House.

The following mobilized at Sylvanpark and took part in the attack.
