REPORT OF ACTION OF L9th inst.

Nineteen men of A.S.U., leftmJOHNSTOWN HOUSE, F.9. 8.5. P.M. going E. then N. then E then N. through CARRIGLEA CONVENT grounds and BALLYMACMAGUE, across Rly. and E by CAPPOQUIN road to Cross roads E.10. east of BALLYCOE HOUSE, to act as protection prty for local companies who were detailed for demolition of OLD PIKE Bridge A.S.U. were to be reinforced by armed parties from Coy's.

18/3

Before leaving JOHNSTOWN HOUSE area-7.30.P.M. five men from A.S.U. went to DUNGARVAN, to cooperate with local Coy in an attack on an R.I.C. patrol. They met an unusually large patrol armed with carbines (12). Shote were exchanged and our party withdrew-9.P.M. DUNGARVAN.

11.30. P.M.

18/3

While main body of A.S.U., were waiting for local units and the five A.S.U. men, who had been engaged in DUNGARVAN, at Ballycoe Cross roads, motors were heard to go out from DUNGARVAN towards OLD PIKE Bridge and enemy post at CLONCOSKRAINE, E.ll. where the motors stopped. Being certain that they were enemy transport and expecting it to return to Dungarvan, twelve men (No.1. party) were detailed to take up a position at a crossroad where a road runs N.W. from ABBEYSIDE-OLD PIKE road, E.ll. and turns N for BALLYCOE crossroads, the remainder of the forces remaining in ambush at BALLYCOE cross. Local units and 5 A.S.U. men had joined main body at 11.35.P.M.

19/3.

At 2.30. A.M. No.1. party attacked enemy car coming from OLD PIKE, which rushed through and halted a mile nearer DUNGARVAN and turned round, the occupants dismounting and retuning on foot. Some of No. 2. party coming to reinforce No. 1. intercepted this

enemy party but were over zealous in halting them with the regult that the enemy p rty ran way and were chased for half a mile to within a few yards of their car-about a mile from DUNG ARVAN.

Meanwhile No.1. party were fired on by enemy who arrived in a second car (CROSSLEY) and dismounted.

3.30 A.M. No.1. party changed front but had to retire as they were attacked on two fronts. Part of No.2. party were attack on Crossley party. Some of the continued attack on Crossley party. Some of the enemy party that was chased towards Dungarvan excaped; three were captured, 1.e. CAPT. THOMAS, o/e DUNGARVAN enemy forces, one private of "the BUFFS" and one R.I.C.

man; also two rifles (L.E.), 200 rds. .303 SAA., 25 MILLS hand grenades No. 23(?) one Colt .455 auto and 12 rds., one .380 Webley Auto and 20(?) rds. (Webley subsequently lost) also some code messages, which were forwarded to D/1. The two military were released and given shelter in seprate houses, being warned

not to move till dawn. Enemy car damaged by Hand Grenades placed on petrol tank and exploded.

5. A.M. What remained of reinforcing arty No. 2 retired 19/3 towards KILBOGinet (E. LO.). Here they met mixed party No. 1. and others. Fourteen men returned to place of action to search for arms or attack enemy fatigue party.

7.30-8.A.M.

Attacked enemy fatigue prty. Our force in open order in field. Enemy in dose order escorting remnants of Cross tender drawn by horses. Surprise on both sides. We opened fire. Enemy had good cover and returned fire. One of ours killed immediately, and one wounded very badly (died 5.P.M. same day) R.I.P. Enemy casualties 3 (or more) killed. Wounded 7. Here we lost Webley Auto .380. 3 or 4 bombs and some .303 SAA. Enemy retreated to DUNGARVAN. We fell back towards KILGOBNET (No. 10.E.)

No. 2 party reinforcing, forced this enemy (Grossley) party to retire and their Crossley was burned by 5 men of No.1. party who after having failed to get in touch with No. 2, party fell back to a prearranged mobilization point. Not finding anyone there theywent on to KILGOBNET, returning to the attack 7.30-8 A.M. with others. The R.I.C. man captured was shot about 6. A.M. at a joint in a field at the "full Stop" after CAS. over KILGOBNET. 10. E.

19/3

Reinfercements arrived from WATERFORD CITY between 9 and 10 A.M. with 1 armoured car, 1 Bomb proof and 7 other lorries. These removed the body of dead R.I.C. man with great caution. This par. is in place of more exact information.

19/3 Dark hours.

Verey lights and parchment lights were sent up from DUNGAR VAN military and R.I.C. barracks, and from CAP OQUIN R.I.C. barracks.

18/3-19/3 night.

The bridge on FINISK river on the CAPPOQUIN-DUNGARVAN road 9. E. under C of CAPPAGH was made impassible for vehicles.
